MISSION AND VISION OF CRISTO REY ATLANTA JESUIT HIGH SCHOOL

Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit High School is a Catholic learning community that educates young people of limited economic means, of any faith or creed, to become men and women for and with others. Through a rigorous college preparatory curriculum, integrated with a relevant work study experience, students graduate prepared for college and life. Through our academic, extracurricular and Corporate Work Study programs, we aim to create graduates who are Open to Growth, Intellectually Competent, Religious, Loving, Committed to Justice, and Work Experienced.

Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit has been serving students in the greater Atlanta metro area since 2014. Our more than 500 students come from 13 different counties and represent diverse backgrounds. Fifty-two percent of our students identify as Hispanic/Latino, 39% as Black/African American, 8% as Asian/Pacific Islander, and 1% as Other.

Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit is sponsored by the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits. Jesuit education is, has been, and always will be focused on educating the whole person: mind, spirit, and body. We are proud to be part of this more than 450-year-old Jesuit educational tradition that includes 60 Jesuit high schools in the United States, 14 of which are Cristo Rey schools.

Students at Cristo Rey Atlanta Jesuit can participate in 36 clubs and sports, including baseball, basketball, cheerleading, cross country, golf, soccer, tae kwon do, and volleyball. They grow in their faith by participating in masses and retreats at every grade level and students find a sense of community in special traditions, including Draft Day, where they are given their Corporate Work Study assignments, and the annual Mass of the Holy Spirit. Students go to work in the offices of more than 130 corporate partners throughout Atlanta and learn in classrooms on the school's campus, which includes six floors, a beautiful gymnasium, a small practice field, computer labs, and the St. Ignatius Commons.

THE CRISTO REY NETWORK'S PRINCIPAL PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

The following standards articulate the expectations for a principal in a Cristo Rey Network school:

In collaboration with the President, the Principal ensures the Catholicity of the school and works to ensure that all students and staff grow in their relationship to God.

2. Equity and Cultural Responsiveness:

The Principal strives for equity of educational opportunity, employing culturally responsive practices that promote each student's academic success and well-being.

3. Building and Maintaining a School Culture:

The Principal cultivates a positive school culture defined by shared purpose and vision, high expectations, professionalism, and accountability to ensure the success and well-being of each student.

4. Leading and Managing Continuous Improvement:

The Principal works with the school staff and community to create and implement the systems necessary to ensure a safe and productive environment and that support the ongoing achievement of School and Network improvement priorities.

5. Improving Teaching and Learning:

Curriculum: The Principal develops and supports intellectually rigorous and coherent systems of curriculum, instruction, and assessment to promote each student's academic success and well-being. *Instruction:* The Principal implements systems of curriculum, instruction, and assessment that promote the mission, vision, and core values of the school, embody high expectations for student learning, and align with specific academic standards.

Assessment: The Principal aligns curriculum, instruction, and assessment within and across grade levels to promote student academic success and help develop the habits of learners that lead to academic success.

6. Developing Professional Capacity of Instructional and Student Support Personnel:

The Principal develops the professional capacity and practice of school personnel to promote each student's academic success and well-being.

Working together with the President and Corporate Work Study Director, the Principal ensures that highly effective instruction is taking place and that the social/emotional well-being of students is maintained to facilitate a safe, productive learning environment.
